The course will be a thematic investigation of the main trends characterising the contemporary world. It will familiarise students with those themes helping them to make good use of official sources and databases.

These are in the main the topics of the course: the issue of inflation and the financialisation of the global economy since the 1980s; the third world debt and international finance; trade and financial liberalisation after 1973; the rise of China and the Brics countries; decline and deindustrialisation in the USA and Europe; the growth of non state actors (i.e. multinationals); globalisation, crisis (i.e. 2009 and Covid) and war.

None in particular. But some knowledge of the balance of payments and its working will be crucial in the understanding of the relations between China and the USA.

Lectures.

	Written exams of the duration of two hours in which students will be asked to attempt four out eight questions
	The lectures will revolve around the following macro-themes: 1) the financialisation of the global economy 2) the opening up of developing countries to the global economy 3) the evolution of global governance 4) the industrialisation of China, South Korea and Brazil 5) new technologies and new industries 6) the boom of multinational business 7) The China-US relationship and the new working of the global economy 8) the end of the URSS, the rise of Japan 9) financialisation and instability: the 2009 and the Covid crisis 10) towards a multilateral world?
